Having the girls now part of our club is fantastic; they bring a breath of fresh air to the club. None of the girls had played footy before joining Noranda, but the improvement in skills by season's end and the enjoyment they displayed made all the hard work worthwhile. With more time over the off-season to further recruit, the increased exposure of the AFL Women's League and the continued support of the WAFC, I guarantee our program will go from strength to strength!

We again hosted the 'Champions League', now in its second year, it's a pre-season competition for Yr10-12 teams combining community clubs and schools from around the metropolitan area. Our very own Yr12's participated and the competition provided all teams with a good pre-season hit-out.

We are very proud of our facilities at Lightning Park and are the envy of many clubs. The WAFC and East Perth often refer to Lightning Park and our club as the first 'go-to' venue when they need a club to host an important competition or game. This season was no different with hosting,

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# YOUTH GIRLS

## COACH'S REPORT

2017 was a milestone for Noranda Hawks as it marked the first year of fielding a Female team. We commenced our season with a handful of players with not a year of experience between them, but progressed to fielding a team of 14 players by the season's end. Due to our low numbers we initially trained one day a week but with the increase of numbers and the commitment the players showed to attending training we were able to add an additional day of training to our routine. Starting with basic skills and game sense drills the girls quickly developed a fundamental knowledge of not only the rules and skills of the game but an understanding of the very essence of what it meant to become a team. These girls developed a bond like no other and by the end of the season it was clear that they had learnt each other's strengths and weaknesses and had developed a way to work as a team to become a strong unit. As our team had a large array of ages varying from, 11-15 and a shared captaincy, we worked hard to ensure that all three areas of our play had a strong leader to help guide and support their team mates. This year three players stepped up into these roles, Sarah Lakay in the midfield, Shalise Parata in the backline and Hannah Aufdemkampe in the forwards. Under Sarah Lakays guidance on field the three musketeers (Sarah.L, Maddy and Bekah) won a majority of the ruck taps this season. With the help of their two small wingers Grace and Kaiytlín they were able to bring the ball swiftly down to the forward line. Although to start with our shots and goal were few, by the end of season we were able to put the scores on the board by ensuring that we worked together as a forward line and maintained possession within our forward 50, until we had a clear shot on goal. Being a new and inexperienced team our backline was flooded more often than not by the opposition but Shalise and her backline worked tirelessly to ensure we forced the opposition into a turnover to limit their shots on goal keeping their score as low as possible. We really started to see the progression of the girl's skill by the final few games of the season when we started reducing once large margin losses to being able to win a majority of the quarters only to lose the games by a few points. As a coach it is a satisfying feeling when a player such as Tegan Lambert (our winner of the Most Improved award) shows a massive development of her skills in the course of only a season, her ability to read the ball and make decisions under immense pressure contributed greatly to our ability to keep within a close margin. All in all I think this was a successful first season and just a taste of what's to come in 2018.

Thank you to all those involved that contributed to establishing this team. Thank you to the parents and the players for your time and commitment and to all those that helped make this season great. Women's football is an absolute passion of mine and I am so grateful for the opportunity to be a part of this milestone in the clubs history, I look forward to helping establishing our second team next season and further developing our pre existing team, be sure you don't miss out on next year's adventure.
